## the music alphabet & the alto clef

The musical alphabet is the letters we use for naming pitches. The alphabet consists of seven letters: A, B, C, D, E, F, G. After "G" the alphabet repeats.

1. On the line below, write out the musical alphabet three times in a row:

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2. Now write it backwards three times in a row (G, F, E, D, C, B, A):

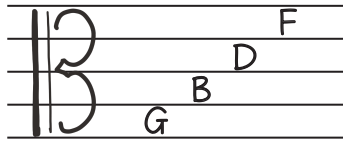
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Memorize by saying it over and over again.

 GFEDCBAGFEDCBAGFE...

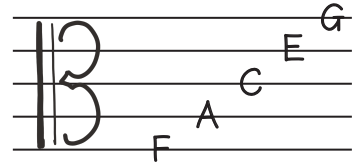


Each letter occupies a specific line or space on the treble clef.

The spaces use the letters  
G-B-D-F



The lines use the letters  
F-A-C-E-G
